
Hoses on Outside Spigots

If you reside in a development where you have an outside spigot, and you have a water hose attached to the spigot, you need to remove the hose to prevent the spigot from freezing and breaking. If you are not able to remove the hose from the spigot, call the office and maintenance will remove it for you. Damages caused by failure to remove the hose will be charged to the resident and could be costly. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.



FYI: Candles

Candles cause black soot marks on walls. In order to clean the soot off the walls, we have to scrub the walls, re-prime, then repaint them. If you continue to burn soot producing candles, the same marks will reappear. You can prevent this by buying high-quality, unscented candles and keep the wicks trimmed and the candles out of containers.



Dryer Vents

Reminder! If dryer is vented into a lint box, please remember you have to keep about 1/2 - 1" of water in the box. This is so the water will catch the lint. Thank you for your cooperation!

Easy Chicken Casserole

Ingredients:


4 Skinless, Boneless Chicken Breasts
1 (10.75 ounce) Can Condensed cream
of Chicken Soup
1 cup Sour Cream
32 Buttery Round Crackers
1/4 cup Chopped Onion
1/4 cup Chopped Mushrooms

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Boil chicken until cooked through (no longer pink inside) about 20 to 30 minutes. Chop into bite size pieces and place in a 9 x 13 inch baking dish.

Combine soup, sour cream, onion & mushrooms. Pour mixture over chicken and top with crumbled crackers. Cover and bake at 350 degrees F for over 30 minutes.



Thanksgiving Cheese Ball

Ingredients:

1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese,
4 ounces Sharp Cheddar Cheese
2 ounces Crumbled Blue Cheese
2 Tbl. grated onion
1 clove Garlic, minced
4 dashes Worcestershire Sauce
1 (2.25 ounce) can Green Olives
1/2 cup chopped Pecans

Mix the cream cheese, Cheddar Cheese, Blue cheese, onion, gralic and worcestershire sauce until well blended. Add olives and mix.

Shape the mixture into a ball, and roll in the chopped pecans to coat. Wrap in plastic, and chill at least 4 hours in the refrigerator.

Serve with crackers.



COMMUNITY SERVICE INFORMATION

Some common misconceptions about Community Service ...

I have small children at home, I don't have to do community service.

* FALSE! If you are not working or going to school, you have to comply with 8 hours of community service per month.

My spouse is disabled, I don't have to do community service.

* FALSE! Community service is for each individual over 18 years of age.

We pay rent, I don't have to do community service.

* FALSE! Income is for the entire household and rent is calculated accordingly. However, community service is for each individual over 18 years of age.

Some truths about Community Service

If you are over 62 years of age, you are EXEMPT. *TRUE!

If you are blind or disabled, you are EXEMPT. *TRUE!

If you are engaged in work activities, you are EXEMPT. *TRUE!



Eligible community service activities include, but are not limited to:

- *Local public or non-profit institutions, such as schools, Head Start Programs, before or after school programs, child care centers, hospitals, clinics, hospices, Nursing Homes, recreation centers, senior citizen centers, adult day care programs, homeless shelters, feeding/nutrition programs, food banks/pantries, or clothes closets (distributing donated clothing).
- *Non-profit organizations serving MCHA Residents or their children, such as: Boy or Girl Scouts, 4-H Clubs, or Big Brothers, Big Sisters.
- *Programs funded under the Older Americans Act such as Green Thumb, Senior Meal Programs, Senior Centers, Meals on Wheels. *Or any MCHA Resident Activities.
